"Our mission is to provide unparalleled creative learning experiences in the Arts in a supportive, challenging environment, thereby generating pathways into future Arts education and industry."


ASTA co-curricular is made up of a diversity of ensembles, groups, troupes and programs, with enrolled students attending regular weekly classes or rehearsals. Some groups involve an additional fee, some are contingent on involvement in the Performance Music Program and some are free. In the earlier years, participation is open to all interested students, whilst in the later years, participation tends to become audition based. As depicted below, this represents a progression from "choose to do" to "invited to do".

In support of our Co-Curricular Program, ASTA hosts a variety of Arts events over the course of each year, providing students with industry standard performance and learning experiences across all areas of the Arts. This means that every student enrolled in any aspect of ASTA co-curricular, is able to work towards one or more performance opportunities each year.

# Co-Curricular Drama





The co-curricular drama program is comprised of **The ASTA Drama Academy**, offering students in Prep to Year 8 the opportunity to gain skills and excellence in the Performing Arts, and **The ASTA Professionals Program**, catering to elite students in Years 9 to 12. Students enrolled in these programs attend regular weekly classes; with some of them working towards a performance opportunity, be that at Arts Festival, Theatresports Competitions, Assemblies, Musicals or the ASTA Graduation Showcase. With the exception of Theatresports, all programs are user-pay (i.e. additional fees are paid per term). Some programs are audition based, whilst others are open to all interested students.

#### ASTA Professionals Combined Performing Arts (CPA) Program, Years 9-12

The School of Combined Performing Arts (CPA) offers comprehensive training in Acting, Vocals and Dance for students in Years 9-10 and Years 11-12. It is specifically aimed at talented students who possess a passion for performance and a vision for a career in any facet of the industry.

The course offers classroom training providing solid foundations across the three major performing arts disciplines and regular masterclasses led by industry specialists. As students often have the tendency to lean more heavily towards one specific art form, they have the opportunity to make their own 'elective' based choices post Semester 1 of the Years 9-10 Program. Students work towards in-class performance opportunities, Senior College Musical, Arts Academy Awards and the ASTA CPA Graduation Showcase.

Elite students in Years 9-12 are invited to audition for one of the limited places in the program.

## **ASTA Drama Academy,** Years Prep-12

Theatresports (including Competitions), Years 7-12

A form of improvisational theatre, the Theatresports program teaches students to think under pressure, general creativity, performance skills and increased self-confidence.

## Years 7 and 8 Pre-Professionals Program

- Years 7 and 8 Musical. An opportunity for interested students to participate in the presentation of a full-length Junior Musical.
- Dramatic Production. Students participate in the production of a dramatic play, focussing on the truth of the spoken word and the believability of their character.

# Prep to Year 6 Drama Academy Program

- Drama Fundamentals, Years Prep-6. Various groups exist to introduce dramatic skills, thereby developing the "actor's toolkit".
- Junior Production Group, Years Prep-6. An invitation-only project created to provide a platform
  and opportunity for younger students to participate in a production ensemble.
- Musical Theatre Fundamentals, Years 3-6. This program gives junior students an opportunity to participate in a Musical Production. Students explore and combine the three skills specific to musical theatre (Dance, Vocals and Acting).

# Co-Curricular Dance





The ASTA Dance Academy offers tuition in a range of dance styles to students in Prep to Year 12, assisting them to develop coordination, strength and confidence. Elite dance students in Years 9-12, with a passion for the Performing Arts and a vision for a career in the industry, can also enter The ASTA Professionals Program. Students enrolled in these programs attend regular weekly classes and work towards performance opportunities, be that at Arts Festival, Just Dance, Assemblies, Musicals or Arts Academy Awards. All programs are user-pay (i.e. additional fees are paid per term/ semester). In the earlier years, participation is open to all students. In the later years, participation tends to become audition based.

These Performance Troupes are divided into Gold (Years 5-9) and Platinum (Years 10-12). Members of these groups compete at local Dance Eisteddfods, in addition to performing at Just Dance and the Arts Academy Awards.

#### **Ensembles, Years Prep-9**

Interested students can elect to join a Jazz or Hip Hop dance ensemble. Students enrolled in these groups focus on developing fundamental movement skills to develop competence and confidence in dance. Students learn and develop technical and expressive skills in the specific style studied.

Each year, all groups are carefully constructed based on the skills, ability and age of individual students. Our teachers are proactive in monitoring student progress to ensure that students are placed in a suitable ensemble.

Class numbers vary each year and are also considered when finalising classes.

# Co-Curricular Visual Arts





The Visual Arts co-curricular offering is comprised of the ASTA Visual Arts Academy, catering to students in Years 2-8, and the ASTA Professionals Visual Arts Programs, catering to elite students in Years 9-12. Students enrolled in any of these programs attend regular weekly classes and work towards an exhibition opportunity. Most programs are user-pay (i.e. additional fees are paid per term/semester). In the earlier years, participation is open to all interested students. In the later years, participation tends to become audition based.

# ASTA Professionals Fine Art (FA) Program, Years 9-12



Elite students in Years 9-12 are invited to audition for a place in the program.

# ASTA Professionals Fashion & Costume Design (FCD), Years 9-12

This program offers comprehensive training in Sewing, Pattern Making and Fashion Design. It is specifically aimed at talented students who possess a passion for creating and a vision for a career in any facet of the Fashion Industry. In addition to theory, students have practical opportunities to develop their skills and showcase their work through the design and construction of entire

ensembles to be exhibited at competitions and modelled at the annual Arts Academy Awards.

#### Wearable Art, Years 8-12

Interested students in Years 8-12 can elect to join a weekly Wearable Art class. Also known as "art to wear", Wearable Art refers to individually designed pieces of handmade clothing or jewellery created as fine or expressive art. Students work towards producing an item for display at the Senior College Art Exhibition and Arts Academy Awards, as well as optional entry into Wearable Art competitions. This program is free of charge.

## ASTA Visual Arts Academy, Years 1-8

The Visual Arts Academy offers a dynamic, encouraging and supportive environment for interested students in Years 1-8 to explore their artistic and creative talents through new mediums and techniques. Exhibition of student work, cutting edge digital experiences and access to professional practices, materials and techniques, are all features of this program. The ASTA Art Stars groups run three days per week, catering for different ages and ability levels.

These programs are user-pay (i.e. additional fees are paid per term/semester).




# Media Traineeships, Year 11 ASTA FTM Students

Year 11 students enrolled in the ASTA Professionals Years 11-12 Film, TV and New Media Program have the opportunity to apply for a school-based traineeship. Successful students work towards the completion of a Nationally Recognised Certificate III in Screen and Media (CUA31015), while being employed in the Media Department at Sheldon College.

# ASTA Professionals Film, TV and New Media (FTM) Program, Years 9-12

Talented students, who possess a passion for Film, Television and other Media and achieve quality outcomes in the curriculum subject work, are invited to join this Program. It offers creative classroom training across the various and constantly evolving Media disciplines. This is coupled with experience and exposure gained through active involvement in filming, photographing, editing and media event management for weekly assemblies, sporting events, marketing campaigns and large scale performing arts events. In addition to weekly classes, the Year 11-12 students are also involved in a rotation assembly schedule from 7.15am each Friday.

# Co-Curricular Performance Music Program



The co-curricular Music Program offers **music tuition** to around 600 students and boasts more than 30 **ensembles** that rehearse weekly. Students enrolled in instrumental or vocal tuition attend regular weekly classes and work towards performance opportunities.

Music tuition is user-pay (i.e. additional fees are paid per term/semester) and includes membership of the instrumental and vocal ensembles. All students enrolled in the co-curricular Music Program are expected to participate in at least one instrumental or vocal ensemble.



## Elite Vocal Groups, Years 9-12

Strong female vocalists, currently enrolled in the Music Program, can audition for a place in Eve Vocal Ensemble. This ensemble has many high profile performance opportunities throughout the year.

# Elite Bands, Orchestras and Ensembles, Years 4-12

Talented instrumentalists can audition for a place in one of the elite Bands, Orchestras and Ensembles - Big Band, Dixieland Band, Rock Band I and II, Soul Band, Stage Band and Tension (Strings). These groups all work towards performance opportunities throughout the year.



#### Bands, Orchestras and Ensembles, Years 4-12

The Band Program is comprised of core ensembles for woodwind, brass and percussion students. All students enrolled in the program are expected to participate in at least one of these. The groups are tiered, with younger students taking part in Year 4 Band, then moving up to Concert Band, Wind Ensemble, Symphonic Winds, Strings Orchestra, Percussion (I, II and III) or Drumline (I and II).

# Choirs and Vocal Groups, Years 4-12

All students enrolled in vocal lessons are expected to participate in at least one of the Choirs and Vocal Groups, which work towards multiple performance opportunities through the year.

## Junior Choirs, Years 1-3

These choirs are open to all Year 1-3 students as an extension of their curriculum music program.

## Music Composition and Theory Classes, Years Prep-12

Composition and Theory classes are available to all students involved in the Music Program. In the Composition classes, students are introduced to programs such as Sibelius and Garage Band. They have the opportunity to compose for all instruments and enter compositions into competitions.

#### Music Tuition, Years Prep-12

Students from Prep-Year 12 can elect to receive individual or group Vocal and/or Instrumental tuition. Instrumental tuition is available for the following instruments: Strings, Woodwind, Brass, Percussion, Drum Kit, Guitar/Ukelele and Piano. Students can learn privately (one-to-one) or in a group. Piano and Drum Kit lessons are usually delivered in private/individual lessons. Most lessons are during school time. Limited places are available for lessons before/after College, or during morning tea/lunch. Students have the option to work towards sitting for Trinity or AMEB exams.
