



Sheldon College promotes a strong sense of Community Service amongst students and staff of all year levels and our students take great pride in contributing to the local and global community.

An annual charity schedule exists across the College, whereby each year level chooses a charity to support for the year ahead. Within their respective year levels, students find ways to raise funds and awareness for these charities and demonstrate their willingness to support others who are less fortunate or in need.



Senior College students are offered the opportunity to attend biennial International Service Tours led by Antipodeans. Students have the choice of participating in a 10 day Community Service Tour or a 21 day Community Service Expedition.

These tours promote a hands-on international travel experience whereby students complete a community service project that assists a local community by raising funds and building/ renovating buildings and infrastructure. To date, Sheldon College students have supported communities in Borneo and Vietnam.

Students make real-world decisions and take responsibility for their actions, whilst developing critical life skills. Students are guided by an expert support team, teachers and leaders, as they gain a true appreciation of their host country, learn to work together as a team, become "global citizens" and experience an adventure of a lifetime.

Charity Support

Students in this club engage in a range of different community service projects helping a variety of charity groups in the community. The group also assists with projects within the College.
