

Across Preparatory to Year 12, Sheldon College's fundamental philosophy of Love, Laughter and Learning continues to be at the heart of everything we do. In Academics, this is achieved through our firm commitment to excellence in learning, excellence in teaching with strong foundations in wellbeing. This ensures that all our students and teachers have an optimal school environment to achieve the extraordinary.

Excellence in Learning

Daily, classrooms across the College are filled with the continuous cycle of learning. Learning requires an open mind where people acquire, deepen, and transfer their knowledge, understanding, and skills. In 2023, our College's Excellence in Learning achievements include:

- More deeply and intentionally engaging with a quality and viable curriculum (Australian Curriculum and The Alice Springs Mparntwe Declaration) using inquiry questions and meaningful cross-curricular links.
- Knowing and growing each learner at the appropriate level of challenge through data and differentiation.
- Focusing on high-impact teaching strategies such as proactive classroom management, differentiation, learning intentions and success criteria, explicit teaching, modelled examples, collaborative learning, questioning, multiple exposures, metacognition skills, and ongoing formative assessment.
- Designing a seamless and spiraling Literacy curriculum to consolidate spelling practices, deepen reading approaches, and introduce more effective writing strategies.
- Continuously engaging with Junior and Senior Learning Centres to promote academic scholarship and a love of language and literature including the development of our online virtual library.

- Streamlining the identification and support of students with diverse learning needs (Gifted, EAL/D, and learning difficulties) through targeted differentiation, adjustments, and where needed, a thorough Review and Response process as well as the creation of a Learning Enhancement faculty commencing in 2023.
- Continuing to provide quality literacy intervention supports through our Lit Club and other literacy support programs while introducing additional numeracy intervention supports.
- Implementing an Assessment Capable Learners initiative to support students to better interpret and dissect questions and develop a range of strategies such as inking their thinking, typing more quickly, and mastering multiple choice now that NAPLAN has moved online.
- Refining the Ready. Set. #SheldonPrep!, Thrive in Year 5, and Year 6 into Year 7 transition programs to ensure a smooth, seamless transition at key College junctures.
- Leveraging emerging technologies and innovations through the creation of innovation projects and initiatives that explore VR, multimedia, design thinking, creativity, and problem solving.
- Developing iLINQ learning and assessment materials for flexible curriculum delivery beyond the classroom using online textbooks and various learning platforms.
- Embracing continuous reporting as a means to provide consistent and transparent updates on a student's academic progress through ongoing formative and summative assessments, ensuring continual feedback.
- Ongoing online and face-to-face positive home/school partnerships and engagement through signature events such as the Prep Fairytale Ball, Year 1 Spring Spectacular, Year 2 Poetry Exhibition, Year 3 Travel Expo, Year 4 Design Day, Year 5 Agents of History Expo, and Year 6 Natural Disasters.



- Incursions and excursions that bring real-world contexts to our students' learning – Year 1 Jacobs Well excursion, Upper primary Street Science incursion, Year 6 Canberra trip, Year 10 Humanities excursion to Minjerribah, Drama incursions, Dance incursions, and Visual art excursions to QPAC and GOMA, Year 9 Business Education Market Day, Year 8 Chinese Cultural Incursion.
- Preparing Year 11 and Year 12 students to be interdependent learners.
- Providing real-world learning experiences that enable our students to succeed in what is a constantly changing world.
- Pathways opportunities (traineeships, Tafe@School, Certificate and Diploma courses) that meet the personalised needs of our students.
- Co-curricular enrichment offerings which extend and develop student learning outside of the classroom.

Excellence in Teaching

Quality learning takes place when the College places a strong emphasis on excellence in teaching. Sheldon College teachers are admired and recognised for the excellence in their dedication and passion for providing quality educational programs for the students in their care. It is for this reason that we invest heavily in professional learning. In 2023, our College's Excellence in Teaching achievements include:

- Engaging teachers with individual teacher professional learning plans through coaching and mentoring for teacher goal setting and action that is drawn from student needs and priorities.
- Developing Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) which allow teachers to deepen their understanding of current student priorities collaboratively. PLCs 2023 include Upper/ Lower Writing; Spelling; Coaching/ Mentoring; Numeracy Fluency; Academic Talent Development; Literacy development across the curriculum; Cross-Curricular use of Technology in the classroom; Early Career Teacher support network; Differentiation in the Classroom; Preparing students for External Exams and Common methods for curriculum inquiry.





- Building quality initial orientation, induction, and support processes for new and early career teachers.
- Endorsing staff with their provisional to full teacher registration in alignment with QCT's guidelines.
- Supporting 15 staff with applications to QCAA for casual work as Endorsers, Confirmers, Markers, Subject Matter Experts and Syllabus Writers at various levels of responsibilities and for a variety of Senior Subjects.
- Sharing and celebrating pedagogical practices through Learning Walks and Talks, and Watching Others Work initiatives.
- Deepening teacher knowledge and building expertise through micro-credentials- LaTrobe University – SOLAR Lab courses, and Digital Pedagogies-Apple / Microsoft /SMART Technologies.
- Engaging staff in the professional learning required by ACARA to deliver NAPLAN online.
- Investing in the leadership development of middle leaders through Growth Coaching and Instructional Coaching training through Growth Coaching International.
- Presentations by staff at State and National conferences organised by professional teaching associations about Physical Education in the primary school, Portfolio based learning, Language learning and 21st century classroom practices.
- Orientation and induction of pre-service teachers across the campus. We hosted 11 pre-service teachers from Queensland University of Technology, University of Queensland, Australian Catholic University and Griffith University have engaged in learning at Sheldon College in 2023.

Foundations in Wellbeing

At the heart, we acknowledge that student, teacher, leader, and community wellbeing is the foundation for optimal learning and growth. In 2023, our College's Foundation of Wellbeing achievements include:

- Surveying students to ensure wellbeing focuses and needs are addressed within a Sheldon context as well as engaging with evidence-based wellbeing research.
- Prioritising student wellbeing lessons and activities in classroom timetables, the introduction of Wellness Wheels to engage with student voice and needs and integrating wellbeing themes in learning experiences.
- Purposefully designed wellbeing lessons that teach students skills in time management, planning, organisation, and preparations.
- Coming together to collectively focus on wellbeing such as Lemonade Kids 'Strong Juniors' and Australia's Biggest Safety Lesson in Primary.
- Use of guest speakers to remind our students of perspective and inspire them to succeed. This year we welcomed Brooke Hanson and Isaac Loman.
- Providing further promotion of student voice and opportunities for students to share their ideas relating to many facets of the College including our development of the College's master plan.
- Rewarding and recognising teacher expertise and experience through Senior Teacher status and extensive nominations for the Queensland College of Teachers - TeachX Excellence in Teaching Awards.
- Continuing to engage as a community through the introduction of the Sheldon Shout.

There is much to celebrate with Sheldon College's 2023 learning and teaching initiatives and achievements. This success could not have been achieved without the ongoing positive and proactive support of parents and the wider school community
